

LESSON: BUNNY DRAWING

GRADE LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

OBJECTIVE: Students will create an artwork of a rabbit utilizing basic drawing skills.

MATERIALS/MEDIA

Manilla 9x12 paper

Permanent markers

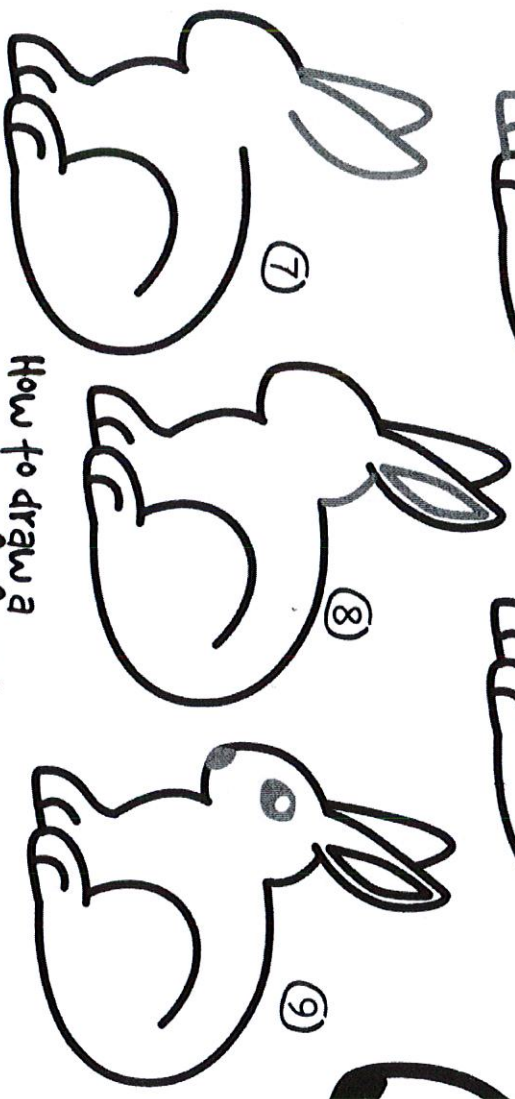
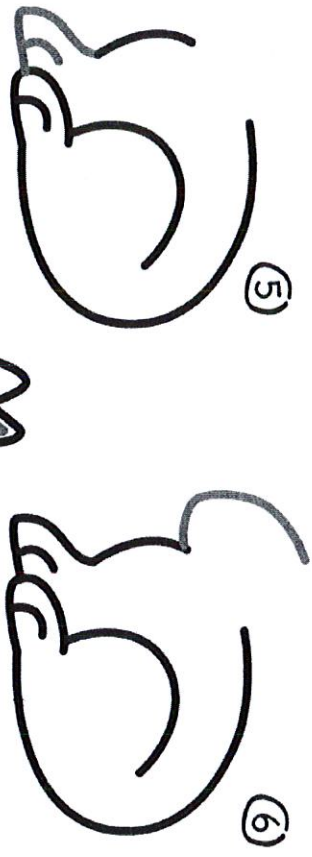
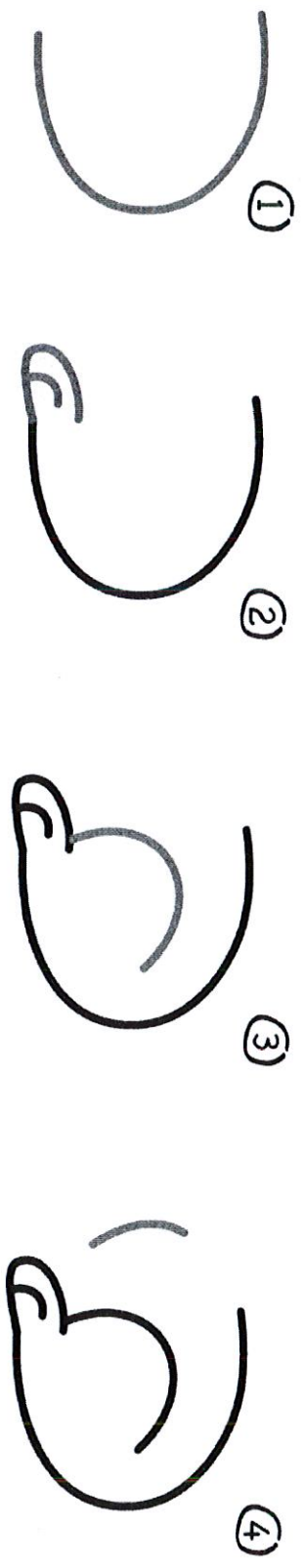
Crayons (regular and construction paper)

LESSON STEPS/PROCESS

1. Discuss the upcoming holiday and show them an example of what they will be creating
2. Have students sit in their assigned seats and pass out the paper and permanent markers (pencils should already be at their tables)
3. Have students follow along with the video to draw their own rabbit (they have the option to start with a pencil, just remind them to outline when finished)
4. Once they draw the rabbit, encourage them to add details to their drawings (eggs, basket, grass, carrot, sky, etc.)
5. Have students color drawing with crayons (white shows up on the manilla paper and purple bunnies are allowed)
6. Clean up with 5-7 minutes left of class and students take their artwork home
